Please bring your cheque book if you haven't paid your dues for 2022...still \$75.




WSC Exhibition at the Fleet Gallery

Mohan Tenuwara is having a show with fellow artist Eric Ouimet at Pulse Gallery New Pop Up Space during March & April 2022.




SKETCHING:
