PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE:



START SKETCHING!

(or painting, or drawing)

We are very pleased to announce that our 104th Annual Juried Exhibition will take place from 9th March til the 19th of May 2023 at the Centre Culturel Franco-Manitobain, 340 Provencher Boulevard. Opening night will be on Thursday the 16th of March from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m., with live (live!) music, a cash bar and maybe appetisers or something too.

The venue is a beautiful big space, well lit with moveable ceiling track lighting. It is nestled between their theatre and the Stella's restaurant (open every day, til 10:00 p.m.), so we can hope for lots of traffic and public eyes on our Club members' artwork.

The CCFM is being quite generous with us and is not charging us an exhibition fee. In terms of sales commission, they will take 30% of any pieces sold, so please price accordingly; we ask that of the maximum three works you submit, that at least one be up for sale. Given the fantastic space, I do not think we have to put too many limits on size, so this may be an opportunity to show some larger works if you want to.

We will be sending out a Call for Submissions shortly — but for now, consider this your bugle call to start preparing your best efforts for submission to the Jury, by either making some exciting brand new work, or sifting through your best recent pieces, which are to be:


- two-dimensional, in any traditional visual art media;
- no more than three years old;
- properly framed or otherwise prepared for hanging on gallery walls, i.e., with a wire (not a clip) on the back not necessary for jurying, but for hanging time, on the 8-9th of March;
- and have not been shown in any previous WSC Annual Juried Exhibition.

To help cover our juror and incidental costs, a Submission Fee of \$15.00 per piece is required at time of submission. Stay tuned for deadline and other critical dates. The CCFM gallery people have asked us to provide them a list of works by the 1st of February, as they will actually insure the works while the show is on.

I hope we have inspired you to start getting your best stuff together!

A few more words from our President:

I hate to be a nag, but I just want to send out a reminder about two matters of policy:

- 1. Photography during sketching sessions is forbidden. Our models are not paid for more than the 120 minutes of sitting time they provide to us for life drawing, and should not be put in the unpleasant position of wondering where on Earth a digital image may end up once it is captured. Please help our models feel safe and comfortable, and put your best efforts into taking up the challenge of drawing from real life, in real time.
- 2. Masks: COVID-19 is unfortunately still among us. Most of us can probably name people who have been infected with coronavirus even this year, many of them rendered unpleasantly sick for extended periods. The Forum Art Centre is still strongly encouraging all patrons to continue to social distance as able, and as tenants of the Forum, we are asked to comply to the best of our ability. I wish I had better news, but until I hear otherwise, let's all please do our part to keep each other healthy.

Stanley Wany: For those who Chose the Sea


Plug-In: Open by appointment through January 31, 2023 Quebec-based artist Wany engages with the legacy of enslavement which permeates his identity.
